34TH ANNUAL REPORT - SEASON 1964

Gentlemen,

The activities of your Club throughout the 1964 Season provide many opportunities for proud comment and your Executive is pleased to record the following facets of a most successful Club Season:-

RESERVE GRADE - REPORT BY R.J. DUFF ESQ.

Many new faces were to be seen in our Club at the commencement of training this year and it appeared that the Reserve Grade would be able to field a team capable of reaching the finals.

The early games, though not as successful as would have been desired, showed that we had a good pack but lacked a positive back line. Team spirit wained due to limited success and the absence of a regular coach. Spirit was revived by some success in the remaining games of the first round and the appointment of a permanent coach. At the completion of the first round our pack remained solid and our back line was functioning well with players in correct positions being encouraged by new team mates of previous recognised ability.

At the commencement of the second round we reached the stage that inevitably strikes all Clubs- injuries both in the "A" Grade and our own ranks. We were numerically strong and filled the positions of those injured and promoted to the Senior team.

We had four successive wins, two over teams that had beaten us in the first round. At this point team spirit was high and every player striving to give his best. These two factors were evident in our match at Gatton when the score see-sawed to the extent where the referee was the only person knowing the score at the completion of the game.

Each player was striving to get extra points as the general impression was that we were down only by a small margin.

After our Gatton game, we all realised our chances of making the final four. Training only one night a week at this stage of the season did not enable us to finish at a tempo equivalent to that of the earlier pack. We were defeated in the remaining two games which kept us out of the "coveted four".

Players such as Graham Thomas, Alister McLeod, Bas Blunck, Frank Maloney, John McMaster and Bob Bentley played in the "A" Grade. All displayed their ability and showed the marks of being in the senior team next season. Lion hearted Terry Jennings and Doug Jeffries, both playing in wing positions showed steady improvement throughout the season. Forwards such as Jack Nilsson and Brian Ward proved honest players, while the back row combination, though never really settled, did their best.

At this stage I would like to thank Stan Ostle as coach of the "B" Grade for his understanding and sportsmanship in letting me poach on his players, even up to half an hour before a game.

To the team, and I include reserves, may I say that I was very pleased to be associated with such a fine group of sportsmen who at all times had the Club foremost in their attitude to Rugby. I look forward to continuing our friendship and playing with you in the 1965 season.

It is pleasing to report that the Club was able to field a "B" team for every one of the 14 competition matches scheduled during the Season. On one occasion, only, did the team play "shorthanded", this was against Teachers in the first round when 14 players took the field and were defeated 17 - 19. This match was played during University vacation when a number of players were absent from the State for various reasons.

Of the 14 matches played, 6 resulted in victory, including one forfeit. Three of the eight losses were by decisive margins, the remaining five being closely contested.

A total of 206 points were scored against us, 155 in our favour.
