Your Committee desires to extend its hearty congratulations to the players, coaches and supporters for providing both the atmosphere and the spectacle.

FINANCE: The Club's funds at the commencement of the year indicated a credit balance of £50.15. 2 in the General Account and £358. 1. 2 in the Home Ground Account. At the end of the year our position reflects credit balances respectively of £98. 7. 7 and £370. 2.10.

The main sources of revenue came from subscriptions (£280) donations (£179/7/-) and doubles (£129/9/9). Our Club House socials and barbeques suffered through the curtailment of the use of Finsbury and only £82.16.11 was made from this usually lucrative source.

Expenditure for the year was mainly spent on Gear (£141. 8. 4), Maintenance to Club House (£76. 4. 3), Tour Expenses for 3 Club Members to Fiji (£75) and attachments for Club House Socials (£57. 6. 0). A sad omission from the expenditure side is the customary transfers to the Home Ground Account.

An alarming feature was the delay in which doubles and an sox money was repaid. As this Report goes to press there is still approximately £20 outstanding for these items.

An overall picture of the financial position for the year is that Income totalled £766 while Expenditure totalled 2719 of which £547 was normal operating expenses.

As the position now stands we need a conscientious effort by all to give support to the Fund Raising Stalwarts.

Mr. G.W. Fraser has now completed a Term on the Q.R.U. Management Committee and has recently been elected Treasurer of that body.

Mr. R.I. Templeton in addition to being State Coach and Selector was Assistant Manager of the Queensland touring teams to N.S.W. and Fiji. Once again Bob has earned great respect for himself and the Club.

Messrs. G. Horsley and G. Rylance represented the Club at Q.R.U. Council Level.

#### FIRST GRADE REPORT - BY G. HORSLEY ESQ.

We started the 1965 year slowly which resulted in two sound defeats at the hands of Brothers and University early in the first round. This was caused mainly by early season lack of condition and team combination. However, as the long season progressed, these problems were overcome and the team settled down with a strong set of hard rucking forwards and a set of hard tackling backs. Both forwards and backs improved their combination with every game, with the forwards especially playing that type of hard, aggressive football that all Rugby followers wish to see. The backs lacked penetrative powers but made up for this by solid tackling persistent backing up and some glorious cover defence. All this resulted in our winning eleven and drawing one of the last fourteen games, which ensured our position in the final four

and on points secured us second position in the premiership table.

The semi-final games resulted in our losing to University and winning against Wests by a margin of only one point. This gave us the honour of playing the Grand Final against University and with a rejuvenated side we finally lost this game 15 - 17 after leading 15 - 14 when the final bell rang, University kicking a penalty after the bell.

Training was very well attended by all players and although we were affected, to a small degree, by injuries, transfers and State player representation, we were very fortunate to have most capable replacements at all times to fill these gaps.

It is very hard to single out individual players for their outstanding ability in club play - it appeared that the team obtained their results by playing as a team in every game.

This report however, would not be complete without paying tribute to our captain Don Whittle, whose personal leadership, especially in the last round, was outstanding. The efforts of Wayne Reilly, in scoring over two hundred points during the season was a magnificent performance and a club record that will be very hard to surpass. Also the staunch effort of Eddie Kann, who repeated his performance of thh 1964 season, by playing in every game this season and always at a high standard.

I would like to take this opportunity of thanking personally and on behalf of the club, Ron Park, for his untiring interest in the selection of all teams and for his personal interest in many of the players. I have never seen a person enjoy aggravating an ulcer so much.

In looking back on the overall position, it appears that the 1965 season is one that, for many reasons, players and club supporters alike, will not forget for a long time. Although the Queensland Rugby Union Record Book will not record our Club as winning one cup final or the coveted trophy of the premiership, I am sure even in ten years time all Rugby supporters will remember the 1965 Grand Final, not only for the last minute result, but also for the high standard of play by both teams throughout the game. It was most disappointing to lose, but it was a pleasure to see the G.P.S. team try so hard and lose so well. This game typified the fact that strong team spirit and a fighting determination to win can go a long way in overcoming superior odds. t

#### SECOND GRADE REPORT - BY R. DOWDING ESQ.

The numbers attending pre-season training gave club officials considerable heart and pointed to a better than average season. The second grade team in the first round was on paper, one of the strongest we had fielded for many years, containing several players with First Grade experience and some promising players from last year's Under Nineteens.

However, the team made a very slow start, winning only two of their first six matches, partly due to the absence of the appointed coach, Des Ross, who unfortunately was beleaguered by ill-health for a considerable part of the year, and partly due to insufficient effort at training in building up condition and teamwork.

The second round commenced with the game against Wests and the team gave evidence for the first time of what it was really capable. Wests, who were second in

the competition at the end of the opening round, were given a 21-3 trouncing, which included 6 tries by the "Galloping Greens".

Unfortunately, soon after this display of power football the seconds were hard hit by transfers from the Club and injuries in both First Grade and their own side. Studies also affected the regular availability of other players. Because of these problems, the team never quite reached the heights of the Wests game again but a tremendous team spirit and a will to win enabled it to continually improve its position in the competition and go on to reach the Grand Final, where it finally bowed out to a University side which would have beaten many First Grade sides.

Apart from one game, when the club incurred the embarrassment of having to forfeit against Easts, we were able to field a full side each week, although it must be said that a few of the Third Grade players were feeling the effects of two successive games quite a few times during the season.

That the team attained what it did is a tribute to the ability and keenness of its captain John McMaster, who on many occasions kicked his team to victory and to such stalwart players as Bob Kerr, Darby Munro, Ken Aaron and Barry Hanson. The example they set was only surpassed by the effort and unselfishness displayed by all other members of the team. Congratulations Seconds on a meritorious season.

#### THIRD GRADE REPORT - BY R. DOWDING ESQ.

The 1965 season proved to be one of the most successful and enjoyable the Thirds have had for many a long day. There was an enthusiasm and interest which had been lacking for the past few seasons.

The Team relied to a large extent on its "older" members with an encouraging sprinkle of younger players. There is little doubt that not only the "buffers" but also the younger fellows got a great deal of pleasure out of the playing alongside past "greats" such as the reluctant old man of the game Gavan Horseley. "Hate-Hate" Hughes, "One Run

Ralph" Hartigan and Gentleman Jack Duff, all of whom turned out from time to time during the season. But the team would not have had its successful season without the efforts of the players who played throughout the season and here I must pay special tribute to Derrick Boyd who, despite other responsibilities, played in almost every game and by his example helped the others to play a brand of football which gave the premiership a terrible fright.

For the record, the team was second on the competition table at the end of the third round, having beaten all other teams at least once, and finally bowed out in the Final to the eventual winners Brothers whom it had beaten twice previously. The Final was unfortunately a question of young legs outrunning the old wobbly ones, as our condition failed us in the last ten minutes of the game, when we had just managed to snatch a two point lead. Brothers eventually ran out winners 17-11.

Considering that training attendances were almost nil, the thirds performed most creditably and from a Club point of view it is to be hoped that the revived interest in the "Old Buffers" in 1965 will continue into the 1966 season.

I would like to thank all the old members of the Club who helped us out at various times during the season when injuries and absences in higher grades left us short. That we fielded 15 players each week throughout the Season tells its own story - this is a situation traditionally unheard of in the annals of the Third Grade side.

To players like Eddie Thorpe, John Friend, Ross Mortimer, Ross Stewart, Ron McNielly, and others I extend my deep appreciation for their efforts for they were the nucleus of the team.

To all those who wish to enjoy their football and maintain their associations with the Club, I commend the 1966 Old Buffers team. Let us see whether we can't win the Grand Final in the coming season. peop in a
