Acknowledgments

May I commence this section by thanking Robin Thomson for his support, advice and good counsel and his incredible devotion to the betterment of this Club, its players and supporters throughout the year. His good humour in allowing his 'Roast' resulted in one of the most successful events held by the Club in some time, with many of "Buff's cronies" taking the opportunity to give him suitable and of course most deserved acclaim.

To our GM Rod Torkington whose job title has nothing to do with the role he performs for the Club, I thank him sincerely for his patience with me as we danced around one another in forming a working relationship that worked for the Club and us. As in all good relationships there has been healthy and friendly debate on many of the issues that confronted the Club during the year.

Pat Reid, the terrier at our heels, worked tirelessly and thanklessly in keeping our records, registrations and committee on track.

Gerry Barlow and Carla Hardy, new committee members for 1999 bought some balance to the committee and showed by example what hard work and determination could achieve. Anthony Ott, Mark Harris and Luigi DiClemente worked on specialty events that were both a social and financial success. Paul McVerry worked with Club stalwart Alby Taylor on one of our Licensed Club Projects and found many a dry gully in the process. Our congratulations go to Alby on his deserved election as a Life Member of the QRU, for many years of service to Rugby.

Club Treasurer, Luke Jacob, found the going difficult with many carryover issues to resolve. He kept us on track and will report to you a \$30,000 turnaround that will see us start Y2000 in the best position for some years. This result did not come without sacrifice (read: we didn't spend anything except for essential football expenses).

Our Club is still coming to grips with the 'professional' era. Club management does require a committee of dedicated and willing workers who double up by setting Club policy. The operative word though is 'WORK' and without this coming from all areas of the Club we will wither and die as the new Rugby world passes us by.

Junior Affiliates

Our junior affiliates have again been leaders in the world of Junior Rugby. Ashgrove - GPS was again the largest Junior Club by far and it is testimony to President Jim Barden and his team that this Club continues to set the pace in Junior Rugby administration and continues to be the innovator of many aspects of the direction of Junior Rugby in Australia. Albany Creek - GPS on the other hand is one of the smaller, albeit fastest growing, Junior Clubs in Brisbane and again this year received accolades for stepping into the breach at very short notice to run the Junior State Championships. Stewart Gibson and his crew are standouts when it comes to hard work and determination.

GPS Old Boys is further encouraging Albany Creek - GPS to move toward self sufficiency, with the new committee asked

to represent us on the South Pine Sports Assn Board and to move to incorporate by the end of Y2000.

The GPS Club does not do enough in the simple things to cement the relationship between Senior and Junior arms of the GPS Family. I suppose this is relative to the problems we have in our own backyard, however this is no excuse for complacency. GPS more than any other Senior Club in Brisbane has its recruitment base in its junior affiliates and we must do everything we can to build a sense of belonging to the GPS Family from cradle to grave.

On The Field

After the success of our recruitment in terms of numbers in 1998 we took our eye off the ball in 1999 with the horrifying outcome that for the first time in memory GPS could not field a Colts 3 side, and while both Colts 1 and 2 made the finals series it does nothing for he development of the Club. It is particularly critical at this time with the Colts age being moved back to 19 years — we will have very few players still eligible for Colts in Y2000.

Notwithstanding this, congratulations go to Andrew Scott and Mick Heenan and the Colts 1 Team who again made it through to the Grand Final only to be again knocked off by Wests.

Joe Anderson again proved his calibre as a coach by taking Colts 2 to the Semi Finals. His assistant Scott Lavaring and Manager Richard Taylor were always there with expert guidance. Ben McGahan again showed his team management skills and the evidence was in the increasing groundswell of Club spirit amongst the Colts players. Damien Frawley stood down from the Head Coach role in 1999 due to the family and work commitments but we are grateful to him for remaining in the significant support role for Steve Meehan, who we threw into the deep end as 1st Grade Coach.

This is the last year we can use the excuse that the premier grade is very young and inexperienced, because even though they are a young side they have all had exposure at the top level. If they are going to produce the goods Y2000 would be a good time to show a significant improvement in final placing. To this end much work has gone into an off season 'GPS Development Squad' run along similar lines to the Reds Rugby College with 24 men and 6 women training under the guidance of Steve Meehan and Andrew Scott. The outcomes for the squad and for individuals so far are outstanding.

Reserve Grade got off to a shaky start with our appointed coach, Michael Beveridge, becoming very ill during the preseason and unable to continue. (Michael is still very ill and we wish him a full and speedy recovery). It fell to Club leprechaun Chris Wake to fill the void and it looked as though for the first time in many years Reserve Grade would give the tree a shake, however injuries and other factors saw a fine start slip away. Chris has retired from active involvement for the time being. We thank him for his contribution to all facets of Club life during his playing and coaching years. Craig Elliott's 3rd Grade did not have a good season on the field, however they kept up their spirits off the field and contributed well to Club life

Justin Steel looked as if he had it in the bag after the first three rounds but the unfortunate 4th Grade draw with its many byes made it difficult to keep the troops together.

Fifth Grade was a – well ...5th grade. Captain/coach Robin Thomson did his best to keep it together but in the end it became too hard with player reliability about as consistent as their registration payments.

Our Women's team also made it to the finals series. Phil Langley and his assistants juggled too many for one team and not quite enough for two each week to ensure that everyone got a fair go. The players' enthusiasm for the sport is overwhelming and their contribution to the camaraderie in the Club is legendary. The Women's team was by far the most consistent supporter of Club functions. Their reputation is spreading quickly so I expect an influx of new talent in Y2000.

Both Junior Clubs will be fielding girls' teams next year so there will be opportunities for our women to get involved in the coaching and development side of the sport as well.

Congratulations to those players who were selected for representative honours during 1999 and a special mention for Mark 'Muppet' Murray who captained Queensland several times during the season.

Sponsorship

Benevolent sponsors are a thing of the past. In this age of performance management every dollar spent must generate a return. We are indeed grateful to our sponsors for 1999. The Bank of Queensland and XXXX continue to support our sport in most generous proportions. Norris Motors joined us for the first time this year. The best and fairest sponsor scheme was particularly successful this year and we acknowledge the support of those individuals who contributed to the pool.

Y2000

There has been considerable work directed toward the 2000 season. A significant number of the coaching positions have been filled, but there are always positions for late applicants. Our senior players have been participating in a development programme that is aimed at lifting their fitness and skill levels. The 2000 season and competition format will be changed to separate those who aspire to a Rugby career from those who are interested in the recreational aspects of the sport. To this end the 1st Grade (Premier Grade) competition will start in the same week as the Super 12 with a bye before the finals series where three teams selected from the Brisbane Clubs will tour NZ to play NPC standard teams. Other divisions will be opened to any team affiliated with the QRU. The theory is that byes will be eliminated so that teams are not disrupted as Grade was in 1999. Other divisions will commence about the end of March.

Colts will be an Under 19 competition with all divisions open to whichever Club wishes to nominate a team. Division 1 will be limited to 12 teams in the first round with 4 teams relegated in the second round to Division 2.

The ARU is allocating funds to the Brisbane Clubs specifically to raise the standard and profile of the 1st Grade competition; to expand the base of Rugby support; and to support the volunteer effort that is the backbone of the amateur code. A strategy for the future of Queensland Rugby has been formulated where all Clubs and Sub-Unions have supported the premise that all Rugby below Super 12 level will be amateur and all bodies wishing to participate in Queensland Rugby will be asked to sign a partnership agreement. The strategy has the broad support of the Senior Clubs with a Brisbane Management Committee being delegated the responsibility of establishing the ground rules for the different levels of competition.

GPS has had significant input into the change process through Rod Torkington, Robin Thomson and myself and in general the changes proposed should benefit our sport even though some may upset long established patterns of behaviour.

Ground Development

Nothing other than essential maintenance of fields has occurred for two years. We must find the funds to do substantial refurbishment after this season or risk negating all the good work done some years ago in getting the fields out of the dustbowl category.

Extra lighting was installed on the third field to spread the traffic load on training nights but the standard of lighting is still well below an acceptable standard for night football. With the increasing popularity of night games it is essential to upgrade our main field lights this season.

Lloyd "Fat Fullback" Graham said the Buffoon in a ruck or maul conjured up the image of a frog in a sock and said it was little wonder he played 335 consecutive games without injury, as he always played 60 minutes of the game on his knees.

Lloyd recalled the infamous 1976 beer strike in Brisbane, and how Robin would drive his station wagon down to Moree in northern NSW, load it up with all the beer he could buy, then drive back in time for the game so everyone had something to drink that night.

"For this alone, Robin would have deserved life membership of Jeeps, let alone all the other things he has done. Nobody in the history of the club is likely to achieve the things Robin Thomson has done".

Lloyd said he was often asked why Jeeps had won only three premierships in the modern era.

"I ask you: with players having nicknames like Knucklehead (Newstead), Ferret (Aaron), Buzzard (Brand), Hector (Hillhouse), One Tree (Hillhouse), Bench (Evans), Fat Jack (Evans), Porpoise (Lonie), Loophole (McDiarmid), Number 8 (Jones), Monthly (Daley), Jelly (Davies), Bung (Park), Boonga (Abernethy), SGIO Building (Asprey), Country (Stanton), Membrane (Armstrong), Raincoat (Renkert), Professor (Marshall), Mouth (Boucher), Whale (Bligh), Sauce (Bernays), Cracker Man (Kann), Woggy (Harris), Baldy (Baldwin), Muppet (Murray), Puller (Maskell), Clicker (Clark) and Buffoon (Thomson), How'd we ever win three premierships?"

After hearing a congratulatory message from Sports Minister Bob Gibbs, the man himself was given the right of reply in a passionate son et lumiere address that defies transcription. You had to be there. And in recompense for the bagging, he was presented with a framed "Australian Legends" jersey, as befits a legend of the game at the level where most play it, the club.

The dedication read:

"Presented to Robin (Buff) Thomson, 'a true legend of the game', by the Australian Rugby Legends, an organisation dedicated to recognising and promoting the contribution of all those whose dedication to and passion for the game of rugby - all it stands for and all it brings - who by their commitment, strength of purpose, opinion, status or stance, stand as the bulwark that is needed to protect and preserve the unique qualities of the rugby ethos from the posturing and status seeking that has come with the age of professionalism, of all those whatever shape or size, whatever colour or creed and from whatever walk of life who under the blanket of a rugby jersey, crest or club, commit to stand together for 80 minutes and as a consequence spend the rest of their lives talking about it.

"The rugby legend does not need to have donned the green and gold or state colours because he can carry the colour of his club with equal pride and commitment both on field and off over a lifetime.

"He can contribute to the wider activities of rugby both at club level and higher.

"He is a rugby man through and through -- he is Buff Thomson - he is a rugby legend."

First Grade Report

Initially I was asked to assist Damien Frawley in 1999 but due to circumstances beyond anyone's control Damien could not commit fully and our roles were reversed.

At first it may be thought not to be the ideal way of becoming the club's 1st Grade Coach, however, I believe this baptism of fire may prove ultimately to be the making of us.

It took me the best part of the season to come to terms with exactly what is required to have a team play competitively at this level. The season began comfortably enough. Our fitness level was very good, thanks mainly to fitness coach Andrew Scott and his programmes. We were always competitive and there seemed no reason for concern.

The first competition game bought those feelings to an abrupt halt when we failed to get out of first gear against a more composed and experienced Sunnybank.

We recovered well enough to draw with Brothers (the best 1st Grade result since 96), a match we should have won, and beat Norths.

A loss to Easts at home was followed by a poor performance against Wests that earned the players a ferocious blast from Frawls. We recovered reasonably well, a draw against Souths, 27-all, another match that got away.

We then lost to University in a match that never reached any great heights and then finished off the round poorly when we lost to Gold Coast at home.

Our greatest problem through the first round was consistency, and being able to perform consistently requires a degree of experience, something we were sadly lacking this year.

A general bye was followed by our club bye and as a result our return to the competition was flat and uninspiring.

We were beaten badly by Sunnybank and if not for two converted tries scored by Tim Atkinson (Best and Fairest) the score-line would have been very embarrassing.

The training session which followed was the most brutal I have ever dished out to a team. We improved immediately and played a very good first half against Brothers, unfortunately due to the previous week's training, some poor decision making and questionable refereeing we faded badly and Brothers finished strongly.

The following week we played well with Mark Murray (who this year captained Queensland) instrumental in lifting us to a good win a home over Norths. This match also heralded the return to form of promising youngster Donovan Slade (Queensland Under 21's).

A competitive match against eventual Premiers Easts was followed by a disappointing loss to Wests at home, another match we should have won.

The following week we were outclassed by Souths in the wet but followed that with a tremendous performance against University at home. We won 34 to 27 scoring four tries in the process and showing all the Ashgrove regulars what we were capable of. Not surprisingly, those in their first season of 1st grade, Joel Boogers (Combined States Under 21's), Chris Wright, Donovan Slade, Tom McVerry (Queensland Under 19's) and Cameron Adams all played well, and are keen to show that sort of form throughout the 2000 season.

Unfortunately we lost our final match of the year by a point (a familiar feeling for those of us from the 98 colts) to Gold Coast, even though we did score two tries to one.

Of all the regular performers in 99 only Trent Forno (captain and Best and Fairest), Paul Farmer (vice-captain), Daniel MacFarlane and Jason Air had experienced more than two full seasons of 1st Grade.

Players such as Damian Briais (Players' player), Adams, Brad Tronc (Combined States Under 21's), McVerry, Couper, Atkinson, Wright, Slade, Charlie Holland and Boogers will benefit greatly from this year's experience and will all mature into very good, if not sensational footballers, and provide this club with a tremendous base to build upon.

My thanks to those who helped me through the year. Damian Frawley, who nearly always kept it under control. Paul Green who seems to have a limitless supply of passion for the place. George Bickerstaff, the club's independent selector, who never seems to run out of names, our managers Paul Cramsie and Simon (Spic) Mammino who spent a lot of time dealing with my frustration. The club's medical staff, Dr. Pauline Smith and Physiotherapist Geoff Clark. Both do a fantastic and sometimes thankless job. I'm sure Geoff spends more time with and knows some of the players more intimately than their wives and girlfriends.

My thanks to Paul McGahan and his committee who supported me and tried to help wherever they could. Thanks to those who work tirelessly around the place without the majority knowing, like Buff, the Taylors and Paul Reid who will

NOTE 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Queensland. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Queensland and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

- AAS 3 Accounting for Income Tax
- AAS 5 Materiality
- AAS 8 Events Occurring After Reporting Date
- AAS 17 Accounting for Leases

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report is prepared, on a cash basis whereby items are brought into account as money is paid or received, from the records of the association.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Fixed Assets

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

Scope

Our procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report and the evaluation of significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion whether, in all material respects, the financial report is presented fairly in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 so as to present a view which is consistent with our understanding of the Association's financial position, and performance as represented by the results of its operations and its cash flows. These policies do not require the application of all Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements in Australia.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Audit Opinion
