President's Message

Financial Members, Players, Supporters, Friends.

I submit for your consideration the 2001 Annual Report of GPS Old Boys Rugby Union Club

On the Field

It could be said that this year had an element of 'Déjà vu'. Our First Grade team did everything, and won every trophy only to trip on the hurdle in the home straight and miss the opportunity to contest the Grand Final. In fact, when Head Coach Steve Meehan was appointed in 2000 we agreed his performance criteria which included reaching the finals in 2001, winning the 2002 Grand Final and importantly getting the Club in the top three of the Doughty Shield and most importantly develop a style of play that the players enjoyed and entertained the spectators.

We are still on track. Y2001 definitely saw the advanced development of the 'Jeeps' style. In 14 games (even the losses), our 1st team scored four or more tries. The style filtered through to the other teams with the level of skill execution being a determining factor. Y2001 saw us achieve the Minor Premiership and reach fifth in the Club Championship.

I expect the successful completion of the tasks set Steve Meehan in Y2002.

One thing we did achieve this year was a return to full team representation. We fielded five grade, a women's and three colts teams and while it was a battle for the Colts Three and Women's coaches to keep up appearances it was not uncommon for fourth grade to have half a team of reserves.

Our off season recruiting has been directed at the colts level as almost two teams of players graduate to the grades next year. With most of the 1st/2nd grade squad returning we have not actively recruited any senior players as we expect sufficient pressure for the top spots to come from this years lower grades and the graduating colts. In fact we expect the standard of all grades to improve considerably. Colts will be a whole new ballgame with the most significant turnover of players to happen for many years. Andrew Scott has been appointed Colts 1 coach and Colts Co coordinator for 2002 and the outcomes will reflect a successful recruiting drive and his stewardship. Andrew will also be the Club Fitness and Conditioning Coach.

Our 1st grade successes are well known however elsewhere in the Club three other teams made the final series – Colts 1, Colts 2 and Womens. All were eliminated.

Despite not making the finals 2nd grade was an extremely competitive outfit. Mick Heenan and Marcus Reilly worked well with the 1st grade coaches in the squad situation and encouraged their players to constantly challenge for position in the 1st team. Their season ended in frustration as they watched their team beat all the finalists in the second round only to suffer from some early narrow defeats which kept them just out of the finals.

Third and Fourth Grades while not showing up well on paper were probably our best team efforts in recent times. Al Smith and George Twohill ran the teams in a squad arrangement and introduced some participation rules early in the season which favoured those who showed the most commitment. Their enthusiasm and drive was a significant factor in the revival of Club spirit in the lower grades and we expect that with the influx of new players from the Colts and a continuation of their coaching style, our lower grades will push for final spots.

Craig Elliot worked tirelessly and unthanked to keep a women's team on the paddock. At the beginning of the season I gave him the bad news that I was withdrawing our team from the competition. He asked for a fortnight's grace — and he was able to convince, bribe, beg, borrow and steal enough players to force me to reconsider. The year was a constant battle for numbers and I commend Craig and the senior members of the team for their perseverance and enthusiasm.

Colts 1, on paper, was the team to beat in the competition. However with representative duties, suspensions and injuries taking a heavy toll they scraped into the final series and were defeated at the first test. Joe Anderson and Sean Hedger did a sterling job considering the brick walls they were forced to scale where not a week went by without a major disruption. This of course impacted heavily on Justin Barlow and Ben Cumming in Colts 2.

With the Colts 3 group being very much a social rather than overly serious group, Colts 2 finals appearance is a credit to the efforts of Justin and Ben to lift an ordinary team to extraordinary achievement. Colts 3 enjoyed themselves. Dugald Scott and Luke Barden worked hard at making sure the players at least turned up to fulfil the Club commitment to the competition. They also made sure that this group gained sufficient grounding in the important social aspects of belonging to Jeeps. We look forward to some of this group playing a little more seriously in 2002 and inducting what will be the biggest influx of new players for many years into the fine tradition of Jeeps 'play hard, party hard'.

Who said Robin Thomson had retired?! Scott Lavaring saw a gaping hole in the second row and who did he call? Great to see a fifth grade going around again – albeit not a traditional Friday night team. These fellows are rugby backbone – they travelled into the far reaches of Brisbane oblivion to play against sometimes not nice opposition on fields that camels would refuse to walk on. And they loved it!

Junior Affiliates

Our discussions with Ashgrove-GPS have been drawn out and frustrating however I am pleased to report that we have the basis of an agreement in principle which will form the ongoing relationship between the two entities. Our sincere thanks to Alan Taylor whose cool head and firm negotiating style assisted both parties to reach a suitable outcome. A major change will see a single social outlet for all Yoku Road users developed in the main clubhouse and the 'summer palace' will become an operations base for both rugby clubs.

Albany Creek-GPS continues to grow and thankfully become more self-sufficient. We have asked that they become responsible for ALL their expenses in occupying the grounds at the South Pine Sports Complex and they will achieve this by 2003. GPS Old Boys has had no input into their affairs in 2001 as they have an active and viable volunteer group. Incorporation was a focus for their committee this year and it was finalised recently.

Facility Development

Despite the lack of funds we have forged ahead (with some helpful friends) with the revamp of the Clubhouse and player/spectator amenities. You will recently have received a notice calling for your 'Bar-Builda' pledge so we can complete the bar and servery in the main clubhouse. Spectator seating will be installed before next season along the recently terraced frontage to the main field. And pending the outcome of our dealings with Ashgrove-GPS we will rearrange the weights room, increase the storage for both Clubs, construct an external covered bar-b-que and remove the containers and temporary office accommodation. The office will be incorporated in the old junior canteen area.

This doesn't top dress the ovals or upgrade our lights. We are lucky that our relationship with Valleys Cricket is very amicable and co-operative. This means our/their fields have constant groundsman attention which ensures constant small maintenance to fix problem areas and even though they may cut the grass lower than we would prefer, the constant watering and constant mowing has created one of the better playing surfaces in Brisbane.

Sponsorship

Sponsorship is becoming harder to find every year so it is much appreciated that Norris Motors continued their arrangements with us in 2001. Ben Greenhill made sure the Bank of Queensland sponsorship was acquitted responsibly by supervising at every home game. The Gap Tavem has reached a ten-year milestone which must go down as one of the longest standing commitments to GPS Old Boys. Tony Mee's Ice Works and Don McGregor's Naturform have assisted in many ways with the refurbishments as has our Bowser and Lever contacts Gus Porteous and Matthew Palsford. On the administrative side Rapid Copy and Concorde Computers have helped with contra deals in printing and IT needs and we welcome Stocks Retravision into the fold. The Caxton has continued with their contributions to training aids and specialist functions.

The Best and Fairest Sponsors dug deep again this year and were a valuable source of income as were those who sponsored holes at the annual golf day.

And to those who contribute their time I thank sincerely as your value is never calculated but without you we could not survive.

Finances

It is important that I take personal responsibility for the unacceptable state of our books up to the point when Alan Taylor once again stepped up to the plate to dig us /me out of a very deep hole. Alan will report another loss which has again forced us to sell more of the farm and to extend our loan commitments to the bank. With our on field progress on track the new committee must spend its time reversing the trend of the past years and put some funds in the bank or at the very least negate our debts.

Representative Football

It can be called a downside to success because it means the Club loses the services of key players at various times during the year. However GPS still leads the way in developing players to their potential and we are proud to congratulate this years successful representative and newly contracted players.

Andrew Farley, Dan Heenan, Anthony Mathison, Torn McVerry and Paul Warwick are newly contracted Reds. Tim Atkinson is a newly contracted Brumby. They join Dan Herbert, Matt Cockbain and Ben Tune who continue to wear the Wallaby/Qld Jersey.

GPS also provided five players to the Qld U19 team - Nick Churven, Brendan Sexton, Shane Arnold, Luke Cross and Torn Couper. Shane was also the Captain. This team was the first to defeat NSW U19 in eleven years.

Carmen Anderson was named in a Brisbane Representative side.

And finally GPS supplied most of the squad of the Brisbane Cyclone, a team in the East Coast Rugby Series which provided an opportunity for players to press for the final contracts in the Provincial Sides and at the very least make the various selectors sit up and take notice of the talent available in Club football. Brisbane Cyclone won the East Coast Rugby series with 12 GPS boys in the final team.

It is also worth mentioning that Steve Meehan and Paul Green coached the Cyclone and that Steve was invited by the Professional Rugby Department to represent Brisbane coaches at an Australian Rugby Forum to set the next progression for Australian Rugby.

Acknowledgements

Unfortunately Rod Torkington has little opportunity to manage generally because he spends an inordinate amount of time running around generally. While many did volunteer to do the many tasks that need to be done we still didn't have anyone to erect the tent or spread the top dressing or knock down the block wall – who did it? Rod did. We are lucky to have a person whose Club loyalty is immeasurable. I thank him sincerely for his support and good counsel.

I am lucky also in that I do not have a Committee of chair warmers. Every member worked tirelessly to keep the wheels turning. Geraldine Barlow with Pat Reid organised the inaugural GPS Season Launch Ball at the Irish Club - a raging success. Then Gerry took on responsibility for all the food arrangement for the year. And then she was a played a lead role in the Captain's Lunch at the Irish Club after the season. Gerry is determined to establish a viable Ladies Committee in 2002, her last year on committee.

You would have seen Paul McVerry and Chris Stewart behind the bars, cleaning up, carrying stuff etc. all year – this was only the day jobs. They worked toward the agreement with Ashgrove-GPS that is almost put to bed for many hours. Chris also carried out the Secretary role. Michael Gleeson worked on speciality events like the very successful golf day and rallied the players when functions were organised. Alan Taylor joined us half way through the year to pick up the pieces in the Treasurer tray and the Committee and the Club thank him for his good counsel in driving us back on track financially. He will leave a clear position for the new Treasurer who will need to be ruthless with the new Committee to ensure the Club continues to be financially viable. Our player Rep. Paul Farmer found it hard to make meetings as they clashed with training and work however he was able to assist Alan Taylor with some issues related to the books and to offer advice to the old f.... on what the players needs were.

GPS must be a great place to work because we are the only Club to retain the services of the same Development Officer in 2001. Andrew Scott continued his work for the QRU in providing opportunities for people to play rugby in non rugby environments as well as his role at GPS which includes improving the transition from school to Club, recruitment of Colts, wider awareness of the GPS Club in the TAS, IAS and GPS school systems, liaison with Ashgrove-GPS and Albany Creek-GPS Clubs to assist them with rugby needs and assistant dogsbody to Rod Torkington. Andrew was one of the major factors in GPS fielding all grades, colts and women's teams in 2001 and programmed the fitness work for our players which was evident on the field particularly early in the season.

Y2002

2002 will mark the introduction of XXXX Premier Rugby in Brisbane which could be foreshadowed as the progression of professional rugby into club land. The Brisbane format will be essentially the same as 2001 with the Vikings in the competition for a second year and the Gold Coast only invited to enter a Premier team. Colts will be a little disjointed with every attempt made to play Clubs together, however with the introduction of new Club teams this will become difficult.

There will be an end of season high profile competition to allow Brisbane, Canberra and other players to be on display during the final series of the Sydney Premier Comp. There is little likelihood of a true National Competition until 2005.

Funding from the QRU is being restructured again. GPS will receive more cash than 2001 but significantly less than is required to pay our way. We will also receive \$1000 for each team we enter into the Bartercard Competition. Barter dollars will also be available.

The new committee must focus on the financial aspects of the Club. It is also essential that all members support the Club initiatives and contribute to the ongoing success off the field. Players need to realise that being members of a Club does not mean the Club does everything for you. YOU are the Club - YOU have to do something for the Club - otherwise the Club will cease to exist. We have a great Club - it is up to all of us to keep it that way. We must not betray what GPS stands for - to promote and foster rugby excellence and to assist its members along the pathway of life.
