Gentlemen,

Your Executive submits for your consideration the Annual Report and Balance Sheet for 1962.

The past season has not been as successful as we would have wished, both financially and numerically. This was due mainly, as you will see by the Balance Sheet, to the great expense incurred in the purchasing of gear. Jerseys were bought this year, for the "A" Grade and two Junior sides. The decrease in the numerical strength of the Club was shown in that for the first Reserve Grade Match of the year we fielded only fourteen men. This would have continued throughout the year had not retired Members helped us out. However, we do not expect this next year as there is a possibility of a good influx from the schools. This was quite evident at the Annual Dinner.

A trip to play Colleagues Rugby Football Club in Sydney was arranged earlier in the year, but this trip fell through as the two Clubs did not have coinciding weekends. After the disappointment in this a weekend at Armidale was arranged,

where we played Armidale City Rugby Football Club. A thoroughly good time was had by all, our stay culminating in a 23-0 victory over the host side.

Our President Mr. W.H. Boyd has done a fine job as Chairman of the 1962 Q.R.U. Management Committee. Mr. R.I Templeton was elected to the State Board of Selectors and as State Coach Mr. G.D. Rylance was liasion Officer for the 1962 All Blacks' visit to Queensland and our Senior Vice-President Mr. H.F. Edwards has done an excellent job as President of the Queensland Rugby Union.

COMPETITION GAMES: Two teams were nominated at the General Meeting, one each for the "A" and "Reserve" Grades.

The season commenced with a seven-a-side competition organised by Eastern Suburbs Rugby Club. Four teams were entered by G.P.S., Our No. 1 team taking the honours by winning the Gloucester Shield for the second successive year.

"A" GRADE: In the first round the team won three out of a possible six. From the six games played in the second round G.P.S. won only two games. The third and final round was the most successful, the team winning four of the six games.

RESERVE GRADE: Owing to the great shortage of players the Reserve Grade was very lucky on some days to have been able to field a team at all. When the Under 21 competition faded out the influx of players from that grade swelled the ranks the Reserve Grade and for a time it looked as though the team might have made the final four after having registered good wins over the top teams. However, for no reason at all the majority of under 21 boys stopped playing and the Reserve Grade was again badly short of players. Special praise must go to Coach Alan Edwards for the fine job he performed in adverse conditions.

TRAINING AND COACHING: As usual training commenced in early February and consisted of touch football and a solid work-

out in callisthenics before the individual coaches took charge. Bob Templeton again did a fine job as coach of the "A" Grade. Alan Edwards as coach of the Reserve Grade, must be thanked for the great effort he put into his team.

"A" GRADE.

The 1962 Season promised to be another bright one for the Club, as the A Grade XV, which had so convincingly won the premiership in 1961 was virtually intect. It was then that the boys started to reveal their true form and realise their potential. In the latter games they played really well, and I am fully confident that had they displayed this form earlier and made the semi-finals they then would have taken a lot of stopping from winning the 1962 premiership.

However, this is all history now, but I hope that we have all learned that success cannot be achieved no matter what the potential without a sustained and concentrated effort from all members in the team.

This year, at the request of the players, training was stepped up to three nights a week, and was attended by most Members of the A Grade squad. The side was led most ably by Garth Hughes, who strove to get the best out of his team at all times. He was one Member who fully realised that a maximum effort was needed if we were to get the most out of our team, and I congratulate him on his efforts as Captain both on and off the field. Terry Carew, Owen Edwards, David Clark and Bren Egan are to be congratulated on being Members of the successful State team in 1962. Paul Perrin was also a member of the State side, but went a step further and has joined the honoured ranks of those members of our Club who have represented both Australia and Queensland. The Club is

indeed proud of its State and International representatives.

The Club selectors, Gavan Horsley and Dick Roberts, once again gave much of their valuable time to the Club in ensuring that the best team always took the field, and I feel sure that all members of the Club much appreciate their efforts.

Although we all would have been delighted to have taken that elusive premiership again, I feel that this 1962 Season was a happy one for all concerned, and I was pleased to see that this team could lose graciously as well as winning well. As Coach, I was pround to be associated with them, as they were a fine example of young sportsmen who certainly did great credit to themselves and to their Club, and also to this great game we play.

As Coach, I was rather disturbed at the falling off in the number of players in the lower grades, namely the Reserve, and of course our failure to field a B. Grade side this Season. A club cannot possibly remain strong unless it has a good number of promising young players coming on ready to fill the vacancies in the A Grade sides, caused by injury or lack of form, and I do hope that an effort is made to recruit many new faces to our Club for this year.

I thank you all for a most memorable and happy season, and I can assure you that I will look back on 1962 with many happy memories.
