Gentlemen,

Your executive has much pleasure in reporting upon the activities of the Club during the 1969 season.

One team in the Semi-Final, one team to the Preliminary Final and two teams in Grand Finals - one with a win! - does not spell a bad season. It was not lack of enthusiasm that stopped the Reserve Grade from a Grand Final win; a little bit of luck, and they would have had the trophy. The First Grade played well, but could have been better with more experience, and a good forceful scoring back line. They were also handicapped by the untimely injury to David Clark.

Great promise was shown initially by the Under 19 team, but unfortunately a slip in attendance at training resulted in a lack of numbers from which selection could be made, producing a team lacking in cohesion and determination to win.

Probably the most notable item during the 1969 season was the marked rise in player registration, allowing "Peter Pan Cowles" to from a 4th Grade. Despite its average age and lack of pace, with Reg's enthusiasm, this team developed into a winning combination, suffering defeat only twice during the season.

In July, we regretfully noted the passing of Sir Kenneth Fraser, a long standing club supporter and Life Member. Sir Kenneth was a respected and valued member of the Club, and his death is a loss not only to our Club, but to Rugby Union in general.

We thank our Club Coaches, our Registrar and Selectors, and our Team Managers for their continued enthusiasm and support.

FIRST GRADE REPORT - BY J. HARRIS

The 1969 season was most successful from the Club's point of view. In this season the 4th grade won the premiership in the first year of competition, the 2nd grade were narrowly defeated in the grand final and the 1st grade and Under 19 team both reached the finals. This was my fourth year and third full season of coaching the 1st grade team and I once again enjoyed the activity during the season although this tends to become rather long when training commences in early February. It is always a pleasure to coach players who are dedicated to training and who seldom miss training nights. The 1969 team contained such dedicated players and we also had the humourists like Alistair Smith and Bill James to enlighten the burdens of training.

The team went close to winning the premiership in 1967 and may have done better in the 1969 season but for the fact there were two better teams to play in that grand final and we still remember that magnificent game which was, in my opinion, one of the best finals produced in Queensland. My congratulations to the University team on their win and to the Brothers team on their great fighting spirit.

Although the Club is particularly strong at a playing level, I sincerely believe there is a lot more required from the players to strengthen the Club financially. Too much work is left to the dedicated few and all players should accept their responsibility and lend a hand in the running of Club functions which will ultimately benefit players and supporters alike. In recent years I have become more involved with the Queensland Rugby Union Management Committee and the Queensland Rugby Union Club Committee and in all fairness to my family I feel I could not possibly also attend training nights in addition to the other commitments I have mentioned. I wish the Club in general, and the first grade particularly, every success in the coming season.

SECOND GRADE TEAM REPORT - R.S. ROBERTS

Although we started the **geason** on a rather shaky note in the first round, we finished very strongly and the Season, all in all, was possibly one of the most successful that a G.P.S. second-grade team has had for many years.

We were defeated by University very closely, by twelve points to eleven in the Grand Final, after having beaten them three times out of four in previous games. This meant that we finished the Season as runners-up, winning the T.L. Jones Memorial Shield and the F.C. Lea Memorial Cup.
