42ND ANNUAL REPORT - 1972 SEASON

Gentlemen,

Your executive has much pleasure in reporting upon the activities of the Club during the past season.

COMPETITION RESULTS

The 1972 Season was one of the most successful in the Club's history with major achievements being realised on and off the field. The 1st Grade side took out the A Grade Premiership with a memorable Grand Final victory against University and the 4th Grade won their 3rd Premiership in four years. Both the 2nd and 3rd Grade teams made the Grand Final only to be beaten 9 - 7 and 9 - 6 respectively in games in which the result could easily have gone either way. The "Under 19" and "Under 18" teams completed the Clubs on field successes by reaching the Preliminary Finals in their respective competitions.

CLUB HOUSE

The opening of the extension to the Club House during the year provided additional facilities of which all members and supporters can justifiably be proud. The Club is particularly grateful to the many supporters who contributed in so many different ways to these extensions.

FINANCE

The report of the Treasurer together with the accounts appear at the end of this report.

JUNIORS

The continued success of the junior grades is particularly encouraging for the Club's future success. The outstanding results of the senior teams this season was in no small way attributable to the presence of so many former junior players in the senior ranks. However, support for the junior players and coahces leaves much to be desired. Consideration

was given through the year to the establishment of a Sub-Committee to administer the junior grades and it would seem that this matter should be placed high on the Agenda of the Committee in the New Year.

ASCOT/CLAYFIELD JUNIORS

The Committee was happy to be able to foster relations with the Ascot Clayfield Juniors and representatives of that Club attended a number of committee meetings.

COACHES

The Club was particularly fortunate this year in having such a capable group of coaches and their efforts made a significant contribution to the teams ultimate success. David Clark completed a fine 3 year term as "A" grade coach with a premiership victory and his service to the Club as player, coach and general organiser, has been invaluable.

Dick Roberts, namesake Tony, and Chris Davies all deserved to see their teams win premiership victories with the 2nd, 3rd and 4th teams but this reward just eluded both Dick and Tony.

With only limited assistance, Doug Wright and Onus Maynes virtually coached, managed and organised both the junior teams. The club particularly thanks Bob Templeton, who despite his many committments, was able to find time to coach the Under 19 team for the 6 weeks Doug Wright was absent overseas during the season.

David Clark and Dick Roberts almost achieved a unique double in both coaching and playing in separate Premiership teams in the one season. There is always a shortage of coaches and it is most desirable to have a Manager as well as a coach appointed to each team next year so the executive would very much encourage each player to consider the possibility of either coaching or managing teams other than that in which he plays.

MANAGERS AND SELECTORS

The able assistance given to coahces by team managers is acknowledged.

A number of coaches have expressed in their individual reports their appreciation of the assistance given by the selectors during the season. The club was indeed fortunate to have the services of such dedicated selectors during the season and their contribution to the clubs ultimate success in the finals is acknowledged.

The club would also thank the Club Registrar, Mr. Ron Park, who undertook the mamoth task of accumulating the statistics included on the following pages.

SUPPORT WANTED

Special mention must be made of the untiring efforts of "Buffcon Enterprises" which under the capable directorship of Robin Thompson once again made such a major contribution to the healthy state of the financial report. However, results could have been vastly improved if functions would have been better attended. The Club cannot expect Robin to carry on his own indefinitely, and it is therefore suggested that the following additional positions, with duties as indicated, be considered at the A.G.M.:-

Club Publicity Officer - who would be responsible inter alia for placing posters advertising social events in the club house, ensuring suitable publicity in the Gallopers Gazette and also of advertising all events to individual teams at training. The newspapers are invariably hungry for 'gossip' and general articles re players and Club events, but the club has missed out on a great deal of favourable publicity because nobody has been available to accumulate and distribute this information.

Club Doubles & Raffles Organiser responsible for promotion and organising doubles and raffles and personnel to sell tickets etc.

Club Property Officer During the current year the club had numerous problems with jerseys, and members will note from the financial reports, the jerseys are a major source of expenditure. Similarly sales of ties, socks, shorts, etc., would be more efficiently handled by one person.

It is assumed that these appointees would not be committee members but could be invited to attend meetings as required.

COMMITTEE

President, Athel Flynn, to whom the Club is greatly indebted for his capable promotion and administration during his term of office, has indicated that he will not be seeking re-election. Athel will be greatly missed by the Club and at committee meetings in particular. Appreciation is also due to Committee Men R. Thompson and G. Lawrence who have indicated they are not seeking re election, for their contribution to the club in recent years.

TREASURER'S REPORT - by W.J. EVANS

I present for your consideration, and if thought fit, adoption at the Annual General Meeting, the Club's audited Statement of Receipts and Fayments for the year ended 31 October, 1972.

The statement shows a balance of funds at 31 October, 1972 of \$2773.53. This is a decrease of \$2184.97 from 1971. The year's result however, is after payments of a capital nature on clubhouse extensions totalling \$5339.13. This indicates a net increase in funds of \$3154.16 if capital payments are not taken into account. Again the majority of these funds came from liquor sales, doubles and outside social activities.

The club had a record number of players during the year but many of these remained unfinancial throughout. This is reflected by the drop in Senior Sunscriptions from \$1005 to \$889 and the Junior Subscriptions from \$185 to \$115. A drop in numbers from 180 to 150. This compares with a

"Gallopers Gazette" distribution list of 400.

The major contributors to this most successful financial side of the year are once again few. Hugh McMaster was outstanding in directing the construction of the new clubhouse while Robin Thomson and his sometime band of barmen and doubles sellers contributed greatly towards the flow of funds. I hope to see these people supporting the club again next year with many more willing helpers than usual.
