44TH ANNUAL REPORT - 1974 SEASON

Gentlemen.

Your Executive has much pleasure in reporting upon those activities and high-lights of the Club during the season recently concluded not already covered in the Highlights and Comments in the latest issue of "The Galloper's Gazette".

COMPETITION RESULTS

The 1974 Season was a vintage one, like those of recent years, and probably the greatest achievement in depth in the Club's long history. The detailed results appear later in this Report, and we note with much pride that all 7 teams made the Finals, 6 of these played in Grand Finals and the "Glorious Fourths" took their Grand Final Honours in great style.

Our Fifth Grade side, playing in this new competition, warrant a special mention as mostly ever-young players, and eventually only losing the G/F 15-16; it is with pride also that we record that the trophy for the new Fifths competition was donated as the Col. Kaus Cup, by C.I.R. Kaus, our stalward Life Member.

CLUB HOUSE

The Back to Finsbury after the games tradition was well maintained, albeit, we would like to see quite a few more along and more regularly. On the other hand, the crowd on G/Final night was the greatest ever - a great thing to see and to feel the Club Spirit as a living thing. Three notable items about Sunday nights at Finsbury are the much appreciated food supplied by the Ladies Committee, the smooth supply always of liquid refreshments at the hands of "Buff" and his willing helpers, and the number of appreciative members of other Clubs, and the Referees, too, who come along many as regulars. The numerous overseas Clubs we hosted during the Season, including the English Schoolboys and their officials, Santa Rosa from California and James Bay from Canada together with a number of N.Z. TREASURER'S REPORT - R.A. Bernays

I present for your consideration and adoption the Club's audited Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Statement for the year ended 31st October, 1974.

The Club is in quite a sound financial position and should go from strength to strength. From a fund raising point of view, the year has not been as successful as it should have been. Too much of the work is having to be done by too few and in view of a coming overseas tour and proposed new Clubhouse, more members will have to become involved with their Club. It is a pity to find some Club members still owing money for shorts and socks. It is also regrettable that a large proportion of players have to be hounded before paying their subs and other debts. The soft drink machine certainly proved its worth in putting a stop to the old "drink now and pay later" system.

The January floods set the Club back several hundred dollars, not to mention the farsical \$125 flood levy imposed by the Q.R.U. Touring teams from New Zealand, Canada and The United States sapped the Club's liquid resources to the extent of 150 gallons.

Receipts for the year totalled \$25852 while payments amounted to \$20753. Thanks to the Rockhampton touring team, funds were boosted by \$150, being third prize in the Country Carnival. This money, less the cost of one air fare, has been set aside to a touring fund reserve for a future tour.

Congratulations to the Ladies' Committee for increasing their bank balance by \$326. Their funds now total \$408.

It has been a pleasure working with such a devoted Committee, led by such a fine and able President.
